### **Fundraising**

You will be aware of the success of the Christmas Fair which achieved a clear profit of £4428.00. In addition, the school raised £45.20 during the Poppy appeal, Children in Need which raised £231.00, Cake Sale £352.00 and Christmas Jumper Day £186.00.

#### Sickness bug

We have had a few cases of the sickness bug in recent weeks. It is important that parents adhere to the 48-hour rule, which can be difficult when a child appears to have recovered, but this greatly reduces the bug spreading. We of course regularly remind the children to wash their hands after going to the toilet.

#### **Attendance**

Where children's attendance has dropped below 95% this term, parents will receive a letter with their current attendance information. Whether a child has authorised, unauthorised or absence through illness it is useful for parents to know the overall picture. The current average attendance for the school is 97%. The DFE expects schools to continue to prioritise attendance following on from the pandemic. Attendance of 90% over the primary years is the equivalent of missing over two terms of schooling. We of course recognise that there are some children who have anxiety issues related to school and we will continue to work with families and provide support.
