### **School Development Plan**

This academic year, we have several key school development targets that will enhance our pupils' learning experience:

- 1) Firstly, we are strengthening our approach to assessing children's learning in all subject areas.
- 2) We are also revitalising our science curriculum to inspire curiosity and encourage real-world links. This approach will help our pupils develop critical thinking and practical scientific skills.
- 3) Our commitment to celebrating diversity remains strong. We are building a school culture that values difference and broadens our pupils' understanding of the world around them.
- 4) In the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS), we are developing our provision to encourage active learning and ensure a smooth transition into Year 1.

### **NSPCC NSPCC**

The NSPCC visited our school last week, delivering their 'Speak out Stay Safe' programme to Years 2, 5, and 6. These sessions focused on helping the children to understand that they always have a right to feel safe and reinforced the importance of identifying trusted adults whom pupils can approach if they need support.

### **Harvest Festival**
